Faith and Danger

Transcript from video:

What would you do if your faith put you in danger? If it meant facing insults and abuse not getting a job or education being assaulted imprisoned even killed?

Hundreds of millions of Christians living countries we're choosing to follow Jesus means danger and persecution and these are the five countries where their faith costs the most

Number 5

Pakistan - where Christians can be falsely accused of blasphemy they are denied education and work opportunities. Churches are bombed and Christians are jailed on false charges but Pakistani Christians are determined to meet to worship.

Number 4

Libya - where there are only some 150 Libyan Christians. Churches for Libyans are forbidden. Christian migrants are targeted executed by militants or sold into slavery but Libyans are coming to Christ through TV, radio and internet.

Number 3

Somalia - where Christians can be killed on the spot. All citizens are assumed to be Muslims. Militant groups want to eradicate all Christians. Owning a Bible can mean instant execution. But Christians meet in secret and many Muslims seek Christ.

Number 2

Afghanistan - where Christians have to hide even after death. Islamic extremism is everywhere. Christians are buried as Muslims because their relatives would be punished but people still meet Christ in dreams.

Number 1

North Korea - where leaders are worshipped like gods. There is no freedom. People live under constant surveillance. Fifty to seventy thousand Christians are imprisoned but in prisons and safe houses North Koreans are coming to Christ.

Open Doors exists to strengthen and support persecuted Christians wherever they are and for as long as they need it. Through the gifts and prayers of Open Doors supporters our global underground networks are able to reach millions of Christians with food and medicine, spiritual care, smuggled Bibles and Christian books, training and legal advice. Homes are rebuilt, lives are rescued, churches restored.

For over 60 years Open Doors has stood with Christians whose faith puts them in danger who dare to share Jesus no matter the cost, because as Christians we are family - one body, one church and when your family is in danger there's only really one question to ask: what will you do?
