admonish one another with all wisdom through psalms, hymns and songs from the Spirit, singing to God with gratitude in your hearts. And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."

So this morning though we can't be together doing that singing and worshipping, we can set our hearts on things above, and be filled with the peace of Christ in uncertain times and then move out into the week ahead ready to be living life "in the name of Jesus"
