



This is the start of Holy Week so we'll be celebrating together today with communion.

We celebrate the day Jesus entered into Jerusalem as our saviour and king, riding on a donkey - a symbol of his humility. With a large crowd laying their cloaks and palm branches across the road, giving Jesus royal treatment. Hundreds of people shouted 'Hosanna to the Son of David ... Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord ... Hosanna in the highest heaven'.

They were literally shouting 'save us'. They didn't truly understand how Jesus was going to save them but we do, and today we remember that we have a king who saves us.
